“Are you sure you want to go to Ge-phat to visit your brother today?” At 4:00 AM in the morning, with a 12 to 14 hour walk ahead of them, Thida wasn't very excited about her husband's planned trip.

“I don't know why, but I just can't not go,” Samnang replied. “We have to go today.”

More than 12 hours later, as sunset was drawing near, they were still walking down the small dirt path to the village of Ge-phat. Although it was only a small town of less than 2,000 people, it was “the big city” compared to their own village. They only had about 10 kilometers to go when they heard two motorcycles approaching. As the bikes stopped, two foreigners got off and offered them some water. Samnang and Thida were hot and thirsty, and the foreigners seemed to be nice enough, but what really intrigued Samnang was the cross on the back of one of the foreigner's helmet.

“That symbol on the back of your helmet; what does it mean and why is it there?”

The foreigners, two missionaries, went on to explain how the cross is an internationally recognized symbol for Christianity, and that he was a Christian. “Why were you curious about it?” the missionary asked.

“About two years ago I found a shortwave radio program in our language. At first I listened to it because it was the clearest station I could find. But pretty soon I became very interested in the God, Jesus, that they were talking about.” Samnang went on to describe how he, his whole family, and finally almost his whole village became regular listeners. A year or so later, on one of his trips to town, Samnang found a booklet in the market that talked about Jesus. But other than the radio program and the booklet, they had never met anyone else who knew about Jesus.

The two missionaries were then able to spend some time answering their questions about God, Jesus and salvation. Finally, just before they parted, Samnang turned to his wife and said, “Now I know why we had to go to Ge-phat today; God wanted me to meet these Bible teachers.”

Samnang, Thida and the people of their village are just one example of people all across the country who are actively looking for Jesus; the God they have heard about on the radio!

We are currently in the process of developing a new radio series that will combine drama and teaching to communicate the story of God's relationship with His people Israel during Old Testament times, and explain how these stories can help us have a relationship with Him today. We plan to begin broadcasting nationwide on both FM and shortwave by this fall. Please pray with us as we develop production schedules, scripts, writers, actors, hosts and more!
