"King Who?"

"What do you think about the new king?" I asked Srei Oun.

She stopped what she was doing and turned a confused look toward me. I could tell she was wondering if she had understood me correctly or if I had confused some Khmer words without realizing it.

"Did you know that King Sihanouk is no longer king? The new king is his Son, Norodom Sihamoni."

"No, I hadn't heard anything about it," she replied.

"Have you ever heard of Sihamoni before? Do you know anything about him?" I asked further.

"No, I've never heard of him."

Until the end of October, no one knew who would be the next king. King Sihanouk had numerous wives and literally dozens of children, and according to the Cambodian constitution, once the king abdicates or dies, royal succession is determined by a special government committee called the Throne Council. In fact, just like Srei Oun, most Cambodians had never heard of Sihamoni before he was selected as the new king. Norodom Sihamoni, who is 51 years old, is a professional dancer who has lived most of his life abroad, and has spent the last few decades living in Paris.

But just because most people have never heard of him doesn't change the fact that he is now king. Following his coronation he is expected to make an extended tour of all the provinces so that he can become acquainted with his kingdom and so that the people can get to know their new king.

It is the same with the kingdom of Jesus Christ here in Cambodia. Even though most people have never heard of Him, or know very little about Him, it doesn't change the fact that Jesus is the King of Kings, both here in Cambodia and around the world. And just as the government, who represents the king, must now introduce King Sihamoni to the people, we the church, who represent Jesus to the people around us, must introduce Him to the people of Cambodia.

Today, as I write this, we are nearing completion of our studio construction project that will enable us to produce a variety of programs for both evangelism and discipleship. In addition, the Cambodia Cassette Bible Institute is continuing to extend its work into new provinces with new lessons!

Please pray with us that we would be able to use new opportunities in media ministries to spread the news that the King of Kings has come!
